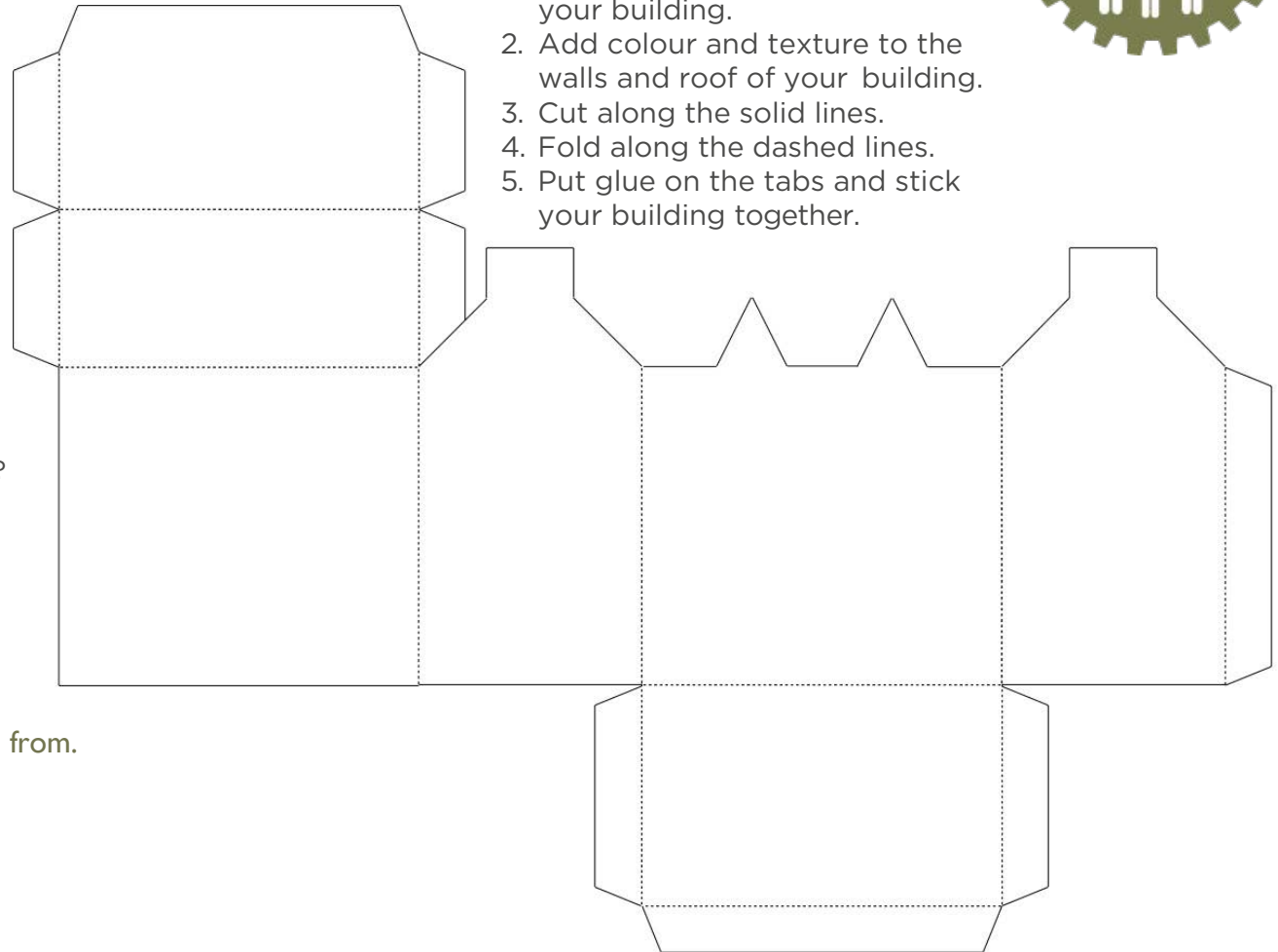

HOW TO ASSEMBLE YOUR BUILDING:

1. Add windows and doors on to your building.
2. Add colour and texture to the walls and roof of your building.
3. Cut along the solid lines.
4. Fold along the dashed lines.
5. Put glue on the tabs and stick your building together.
