

As Scotland's most sacred place, Iona Abbey has captivated and inspired visitors for centuries. A witness to saints, raiders, lords and pilgrims, the abbey sparked a creative flourishing of early Christian worship and art.

THINGS TO SEE AND DO

- Discover the inspirational stories of St Columba, the 'dove of the church' and founder of Iona Abbey
- Explore the magnificent abbey and cloister of the medieval Benedictine monks, whose church lay at the spiritual heart of the Gaelic Lordship of the Isles
- Reilig Odhrain – the little cemetery and chapel where the powerful Lords of the Isles were laid to rest
- Pause for reflection in Columba's shrine, which marks the burial place of the saint
- Soak up the island's unique sense of place, renowned for its clarity of light and air
- A stunning exhibition displaying the first high cross, reconstructed to mark the 1450th anniversary of St Columba's arrival on Iona
