Explore the castle with this fun, fact-finding mission. Remember to ask a steward if you need any help.




The Murray family began building work at Bothwell in 1242. How many stars are on their coat of arms?

How many windows overlook the courtyard from the Great Hall?




Where did nobles sit during services in the chapel?

The Donjon is three storeys high. How many steps can you count as you climb up?




What is the oldest bit of graffiti you can find?




What is another name for a medieval toilet?
