# Scotland's Drill Halls



Project Results April 2016



#### **Preface**

In 2015–16, as part of our commemoration of the centenary of the First World War, we carried out a nationwide review of drill halls to assess them for designation.

Our preliminary report used Dr Gordon Barclay's audit 'The Built Heritage of the First World War'. The primary source for this audit was a UK wide survey of drill halls by Mike Osborne, published in *Always Ready: the Drill Halls of Great Britain's Volunteer Forces* (2006). This data was used alongside historical mapping to find new or 'lost' halls. Research work by The Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historic Monuments of Scotland was added to the information.

Of the 350 or so drill halls built by 1918, around 180 are thought to survive in Scotland. We assessed unlisted drill halls for listing and reviewed the designation of existing listed drill halls. This report summarises the results of this review.

### **New listings**
