Christmas was celebrated in medieval Scotland with dancing, feasting and games. How many days did the celebrations usually go on for?







Winter celebrations happened on the days around the shortest day of the year. What is this day called?

People dressed up and swapped roles during the winter celebrations. What did boys often dress up as?


