



This castle was never a peaceful royal residence. A fortress and state prison, Blackness cuts a dramatic and forbidding figure. That's why it's been a central backdrop to high-end productions like **Outlander**, **Outlaw King**, and **Mary Queen of Scots**, where it doubles as Holyrood Palace.


















Walk in the footsteps of Kings from the past and the silver screen. Doune Castle, built for Scotland's 'uncrowned king' Regent Albany, was **Game of Thrones**' Winterfell in the pilot episode, as well as featuring prominently in **Monty Python and the Holy Grail** and **Outlander**.

As Scotland's top paid-for visitor attraction, it isn't always easy to book it out for filming. Almost 2 million people a year come to take in its elegance and grandeur.

However, the team for biographical comedy-drama **The Lost King** managed to arrange filming of the 1 o'clock gun and dialogue scenes around the Castle. The film follows the real-life story of Philippa Langley's (played by Sally Hawkins) quest to find the remains of Richard III. Her ex-husband is played by Steve Coogan, who co-wrote the film with Jeff Pope.

You can also see scenes filmed at Edinburgh Castle in **Burke and Hare** (2010) and **Filth** (2013) starring James McAvoy.

















David Nicholls' popular novel, **One Day**, where main characters Emma and Dexter have a romantic moment at the peak of Arthur's Seat, is a prime example of Scotland's beauty on screen.



It's been adapted twice – for a film (2011) and the hit Netflix show (2024). Both show the capital's breathtaking cityscape from Holyrood Park in all its cinematic glory.





If you decide to visit for yourself, don't miss the remarkable prehistoric settlement of Jarlshof. However, it was Fort Charlotte, the artillery for in Lerwick that featured in series 3, episode 4.


Newark Castle in Port Glasgow was an inspired filming location, too. In series 7 episode 4, it featured as a stand in for an abandoned Shetland church where grizzly evidence of tortured hostages was found.
























The opulent interiors of Glasgow Cathedral have long been committed to film. They've stood in as L'Hopital des Anges in season 2 of **Outlander** (2016) and the scene of the murder of John Comyn in the Netflix hit **Outlaw King** (2018).



High School Musical star Vanessa Hudgens filmed **The Princess Switch: Switched Again** here in 2020, too. The ornate choir area provided the perfect location for a coronation scene and would make for an ideal selfie spot!



































In 2022 a film crew travelled to Orkney to capture scenes for the film adaptation of the same name (2024). The film starred Saoirse Ronan and shot at nighttime at the atmospheric Ring of Brodgar and Stones of Stenness on Orkney Mainland.


They also filmed a dialogue scene between Amy and her mother at Knap of Howar on the remote island of Papa Westray. The two neolithic 'houses' are the oldest standing stone buildings in north-west Europe and were occupied more than 5000 years ago.

Amy's time on Papa Westray is a key feature in the book and despite logistical challenges the production headed to the real-life location to capture authentic scenes for the film.

If you're a fan of the book or film – or just love to see where historic shots were filmed! – a trip to Orkney should be top of your to-do list.











Quaint and picturesque, the town of St Andrews has been featured on screen many times. Film fans would have so much to see, with the Castle and Cathedral as particular highlights.






















An t-Eilean (The Island) is a groundbreaking Gaelic thriller where a dysfunctional family's world is shattered in a tense, twisting story of lies and loss.

The UK's first ever high-end Gaelic drama series, the show sees PC Kat Crichton confront her past when assigned to a murder case on the isle of Harris.

St Clement's Church features in the opening credits and in episode 3 – so, if you like the allure of a good, dark mystery, you should see it with your own eyes.


















The sumptuous drama Mary & George (2024) stars Julianne Moore and Nicholas Galitzine as social climbers in the court of King James VI, who was baptised and spent his childhood at the castle.

Episode 4 depicts James' return to Scotland in 1617 and Stirling Castle doubles for the streets of Edinburgh as the King's party arrive in a horseback procession.

For the banquet scene later in the episode, filming took place in the Queen's Inner Chamber. Even without the lavish props and actors, this is a place where history can be felt first hand.
















In series 2 of **Good Omens** (2023), Stirling's old town doubled for 1800s Edinburgh. Locations included the Mar's Wark ruin, which belonged to the Earl of Mar, keeper of Stirling Castle.

Stirling Castle was depicted as herself in Outlaw King (2017), Mary Queen of Scots (2018), and has hosted filming for Burke and Hare (2010), and the Adventures of Greyfriars Bobby (2005). So, if you've ever wondered what it feels like to relive scenes from your favourite films, you should start here.





















If you are a **Strictly Come Dancing** fan, you may have noticed that series 21 (2023) opened with a fabulous dance sequence from the professionals set among the beguilling ruins of Tantallon Castle in East Lothian.
