LEITH'S TREASURE HOUSE

Step inside Trinity House, a time capsule of Leith's seafaring heritage. Established to help sailors in need, it grew to play a key role in the development of the port and has proudly stood in Leith's Kirkgate since at least 1555. Today, it houses a collection of nautical artefacts, paintings and curiosities.

Pre-book your guided tour to discover the intriguing history, sumptuous decoration and elegant Georgian architecture of the house; and experience the hidden depths of the original 16th century vaults beneath.
