INCHCOLM ABBEY

CEREMONIES & PHOTOGRAPHY

Inchcolm Abbey was originally established as a priory by David I and later became an abbey in 1235. It is now the best preserved group of monastic buildings in Scotland. The island is famed for its seals, wildlife and coastal defences from two World Wars.

Today, Inchcolm Abbey provides a beautiful setting for wedding ceremonies and photography.

Location

Inchcolm Island is in the Firth of Forth and reached by ferry from various locations. Check with operators for details.

Venues

Refectory: The Abbeys first floor Refectory boasts fantastic natural light that accentuates its arched ceiling and unique features.

Capacity: 100 people.

Chapter House: Dating from the 13th century, this unique room is one of only three in Scotland known to have been built as a centralised octagonal structure. Ideal for intimate ceremonies. Capacity: 20 people.

Dormitory: Located on the first floor in the east range of the Abbey, this is a long narrow room with an arched ceiling.
Capacity: 90 people.

Facilities

100 chairs, 2 tables, LED candles, a table top lectern, a battery powered CD/USB/SD audio player and a red carpet. Two cast iron flower stands.

Additional Information

Candles are not permitted at this site. Clients need to book a ferry company in order to access the island. There are two companies (Maid of the Forth, 0131 331 5000 and Forth Boat Tours, 0870 118 1866) and both would be able to give you a quote for your wedding transport and answer any questions you have regarding transportation.
