CEREMONIES & PHOTOGRAPHY

One of Scotland's oldest surviving strongholds, Dirleton Castle is an impressive, romantic fortress dating back to the 13th century.

For 400 years it stood as a magnificent fortified residence for three successive noble families: the de Vauxs, the Haliburtons and the Ruthvens. Following the castle's damage in Cromwell's 1650 siege, a new mansion was built close to the picturesque ruins.

Today Dirleton is most famous for its beautiful gardens. Dating from the late 19th and early 20th centuries, these rival the ancient castle for attention and provide a stunning backdrop for wedding photography.

Location

In the village of Dirleton, three miles west of North Berwick.
Postcode: EH39 5ER

Venues

Chapel: A small intimate room built for the private use of the Haliburton lords.
Capacity: 30 people.

Facilities

60 chairs, a red carpet, two tables with tablecloths, a table top lectern, a battery powered CD/USB/SD audio player, electric candles and two cast iron flower stands are available.

Additional Information

There is no heating within the castle due to its historic nature. There is limited parking at the castle. The only available toilets are located in the car park. Castle is not wheelchair accessible without additional assistance. All wedding areas require access via stairs.
